A Century of Scouting linking Widford with Exeter

Those of you who have lived in Chelmsford for 20 years or more will remember that the Centenary of Scouting celebrated the World Jamboree at Hylands Park in 2007. Lots of Scouts including some from USA visited St.Marys.

Correspondingly General Baden-Powell (later Lord) visited the YMCA Exeter in 1907 and spoke to a large gathering of many local dignitaries including the Mayor, Mr. H. Gadd, who was also president of the YMCA. There was much cheering and applauding during the evening when Baden-Powell introduced them to his vision of Scouting among boys.

He believed that any Briton who had any salt in him at all was willing to do something for his country. There were many fellows who said the country was going on all right. What could humble individuals like themselves, among thousands of others do to help it on? It was possible for everyone to do a good turn for his country. They could take the boys of the country and teach them scouting and they would find it a very interesting, in fact, a charming occupation. All the attributes that made a good scout were those which made good citizens. Scouts had to be very observant fellows, to have all their wits about them and use them in whatever work they were engaged and to serve their neighbours to the best of their ability without first thinking of their own good, comfort or safety.

B-P continued, it was true there were some 270,000 boys who were being looked after by the Boys' Brigade, the YMCA, the Church Lads' Brigade and other organisations but there were 1,750,000 who had no kind of good influence brought to bear upon them to induce them to become good citizens. Much remained to be done outside of school to

give them character and to make men of them. The country wanted the help of men in this direction and if they could not think of a better way than his he appealed to them to try it, because it was better to do something than to sit down and do nothing at all for their country. What he wanted to do was to attract boys as much as possible and that in teaching them scouting they would find underlying it good citizenship...
