

A Century of Scouting linking Widford with Exeter...continued

...He went on to say, he was publishing a small handbook on how to teach boys 'scouting.' They had to take to heart the lesson that big empires could fall. For instance, the Roman Empire, the Egyptian Empire, great nations that had fallen through bad citizenship and became the prey of other nations. It became incumbent upon everyone who had the slightest patriotism in him to earnestly help, in however small a way to turn the rising generation on to the right road for good citizenship. If this were done, then they would have good foundations for government of the future.

B-P offered his scheme as a possible aid towards putting on a positive footing the development-moral and physical-of boys of all creeds and classes and under the term of scouting he suggested instruction in the many invaluable qualities which went to make a good citizen equally with a good scout. In addition, deduction, chivalry, patriotism, personal hygiene, saving life and self-reliance.

The Union Jack meant something more than merely the union of England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales. The present time they heard people talking a good deal about classes but when trouble came on the country down went the barriers and they stood shoulder to shoulder for the good of their land.

Little did they know of the storm that was brewing across the Channel. Some 7 years later many of those 11- and 12-year-old boys found themselves fighting in the WW1. Perhaps scouting would have helped them to adjust to the terrible conditions they found themselves in and the horrors they saw. YMCA Exeter was in at the birth of scouting. Both were founded on the principles of Christian faith.

Changes have occurred over time but faith is still the foundation on which they stand. We now see scouting as an organisation which welcomes girls and boys. May both Scouting and YMCA Exeter be here in another 100 years. I have edited the narrative somewhat but hope you have found something of interest in it. Bob.
